

Call for Papers

Victoria University of Wellington's School of Education is pleased to invite you to ANZARME 2019 in Wellington, New Zealand from 31 October to 3 November. The 41st conference will take place in the Hunter Building on the main Kelburn campus, a short distance from the Wellington CBD.

The conference theme is *Winds of Change*. This reflects the constantly changing nature of the educational landscape, and represents the political reality of changing philosophies, values, technologies and issues facing music education on all fronts today. It also echoes a Maori karakia (prayer) that we at Victoria often say at the beginning of important events and undertakings, such as our conference.

**Whakataka te hau ki te uru
Whakataka te hau ki te tonga
Kia mākinakina ki uta
Kia mātaratara ki tai
E hī ake ana te atakura
He tio, he huka, he hau hū
Tihei mauri ora!**

*(Cease the winds from the west
Cease the winds from the south
Let the breeze blow over the land
Let the breeze blow over the ocean
Let the red-tipped dawn come with a sharpened air.
A touch of frost, a promise of a glorious day.)*

The theme represents music education researchers' responses to the external forces that challenge, prompt and engage us. "Tihei mauri ora!" refers to claiming the right to speak, which for us is about the authority of music education research within the academy. Thus, the theme also refers to the place of pure music education research.

As always, ANZARME welcomes all researchers of music education, from beginning to experienced, and presentations are undertaken in a supportive and encouraging environment. Two prizes will be on offer for new researchers: the Doreen Bridges and the David Sell prizes are both awarded for most promising new research. Participants, particularly beginning researchers and students

undertaking research for the first time, are invited to submit abstracts of research proposals for work in progress.

Abstract submissions:

Abstracts must be no more than 300 words and include your name and institutional affiliation (if any). Abstracts will be triple blind peer-reviewed and notification with regards acceptance will be given by mid-August at the latest. Earlier submissions will get an earlier response.
